# NATIONAL BOARD REVIEW OF SAFEGUARDING IN DOWN AND CONNOR JUNE 2023



THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN IRELAND

You would be aware that Bishop Emertius, Noel Treanor in June 2022, formally invited the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland to review child safeguarding across our Diocese.

This review took place on 6<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

The Diocese would wish to thank the parishes who directly engaged in the Review, the Youth Ministry that the Reviewers visited and Saint Genevieve's High School for facilitating this visit and all the individuals and groups across the Diocese who interacted with the two reviewers.

We would also like to thank the two Reviewers for their professionalism and expertise they brought to child safeguarding within the church setting.

Our Apostolic Administrator, Bishop Donal McKeown has received a Draft Report which we were asked to comment on in relation to factual accuracy. This has been completed and returned to the National Board.

The Diocese will be receiving the Final Report in the near future. When we receive the Final Report, the Diocesan Safeguarding Office will engage in a robust feedback process with all our Parishes.

At this stage I can say that the initial feedback from the Reviewers was wherever they visited or whoever they spoke with safeguarding is embedded across the Diocese and that Parishes and Safeguarding Committees are working diligently to the seven standards.

# Adult Safeguarding Training

**11<sup>th</sup> November – Adult Safeguarding Training** – This training is suitable for clergy and volunteers who have regular and/or direct contact with adults as a **leader** or **coordinator** of adult activities (e.g., lunch clubs, SPRED, Bereavement groups).

There will be further dates issued soon for Adult Safeguarding Awareness Sessions which will provide an introduction to adult safeguarding issues for volunteers who are in non-leadership roles.



# OTHER NEWS - ONUS SAFE PLACE

There is a growing awareness within the Church and the wider community of the need to address the hidden issue of domestic abuse. Anyone can experience domestic abuse regardless of age, gender, race, religion, sexuality, social class, or geography. The Diocese continues to be committed to playing its role in increasing an understanding and awareness of this issue and supporting the work of the statutory and voluntary sector. One of the ways in which the Diocese can do this is through the initiative by ONUS called "safe place".



## What is Safe Place?

"Safe Place" is an initiative that aims to create awareness of what domestic abuse is, who is affected and the range of support available locally.

## What does it involve?

Your Parish can become a 'Safe Place'. To become a "Safe Place", Parishes need to attend a Safe Place webinar and complete a simple registration form. You are then supplied with a range of 'Safe Place' resources and ongoing support from Onus. The Safe Place initiative does not involve providing direct support services.

\*The registration with ONUS as "Safe Place" must be renewed every 3 years.
